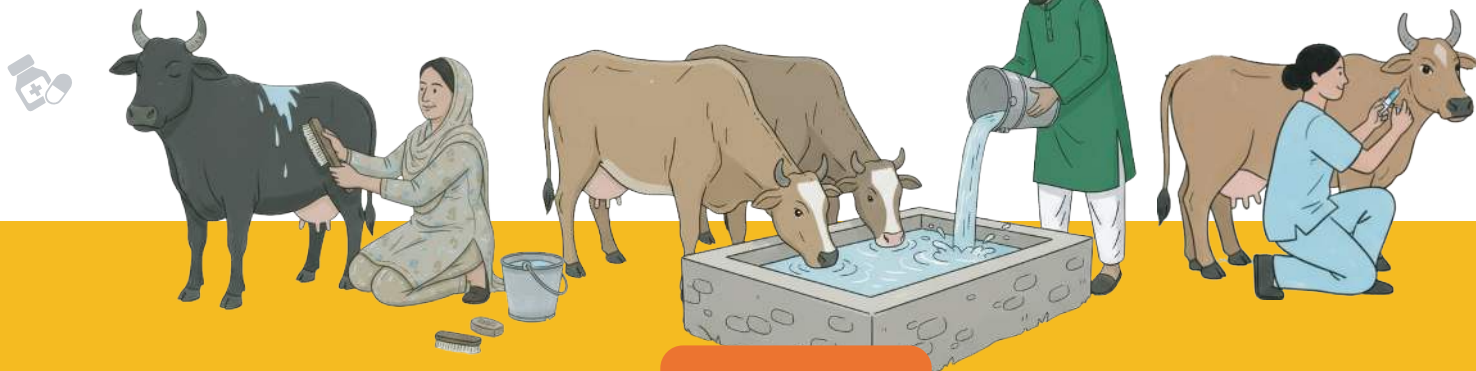

KEEP IT CLEAN

Remove dung and wet bedding every day using a broom and bucket to keep the shed clean and comfortable for the animals.

BATH AND BRUSH

Bathe and brush cows regularly with a soft, old brush to keep their skin and udders clean for healthy milk production.

GIVE THEM SPACE

Mark enough floor space with chalk or rope so animals can move and rest comfortably, reducing stress and disease.

MANAGE WASTE WELL

Collect dung in one corner using a spade or wheelbarrow and turn it into compost or biogas to make useful fertilizer.



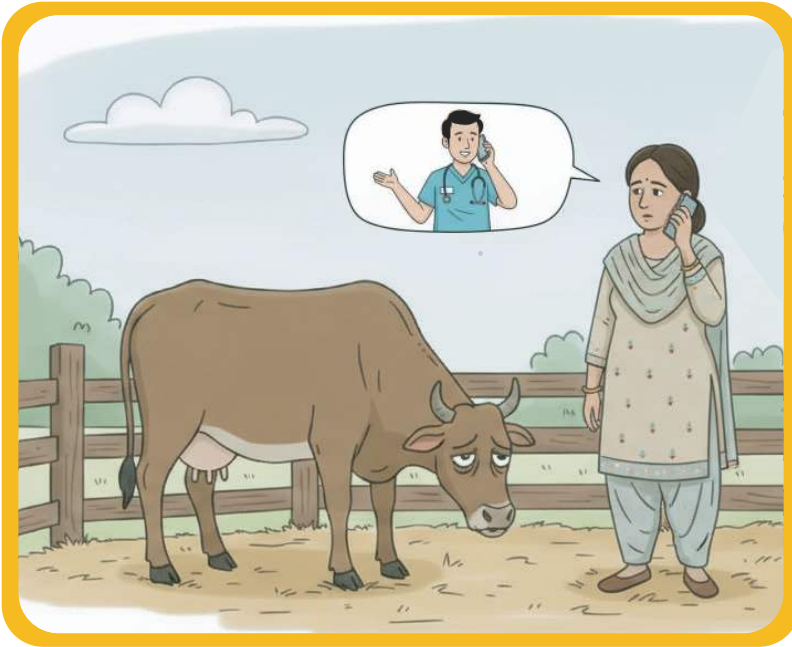

CLEAN WATER, HEALTHY COWS

Give cows clean water daily and wash troughs often to keep infections away.

Give medicines exactly as prescribed by the vet and complete the full course to ensure effective treatment.



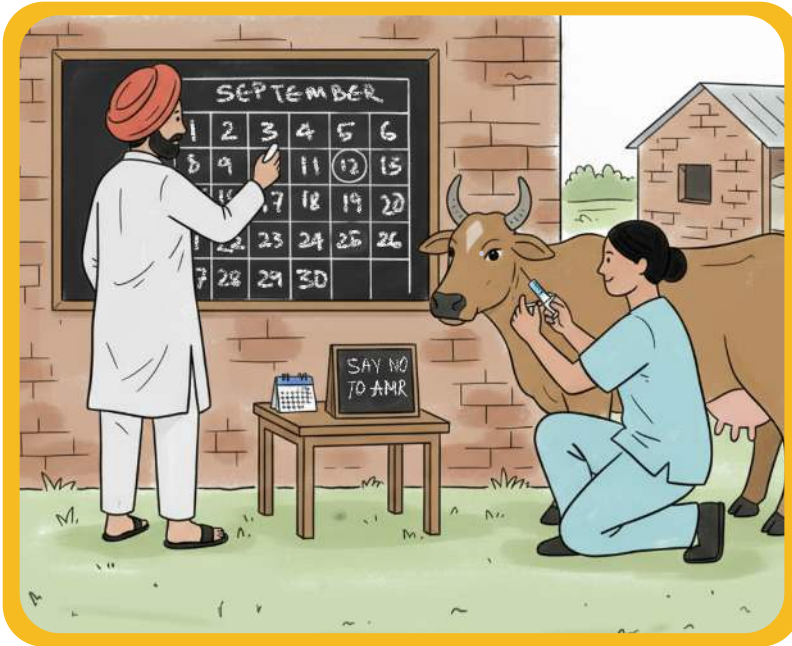

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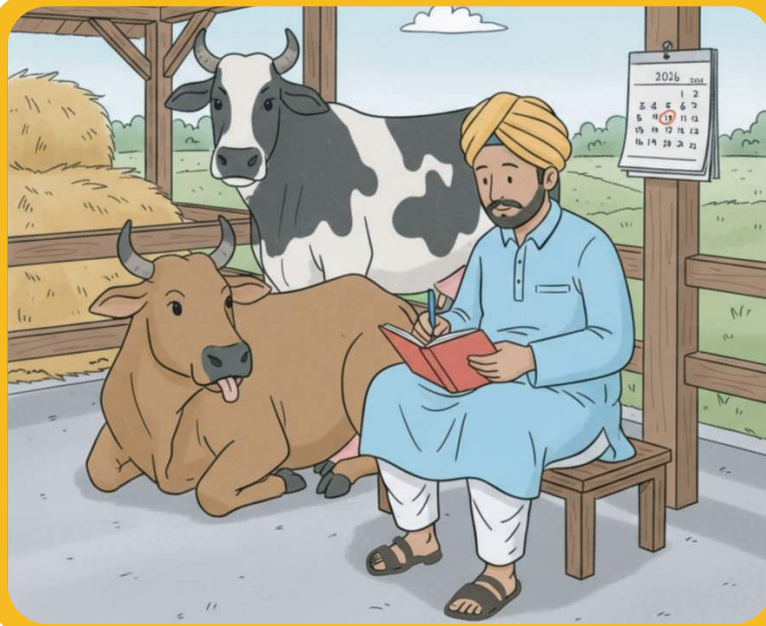
STOP GERMS AT THE GATE
